Charity Quilt 2019

This is an easy charity quilt project using 2 1/2 inch strips with a 2 1/2 inch square block in between each strip. That's it, easy as ever and a great way to use up some of your left over fabric.

Cut your fabric strips 2 1/2 inches wide to whatever length you have. Use fabric from your stash or think of this as a great way to use up your jelly roll or layer cake scraps. Make your block with random colored strips or a fancy coordinated design.

Cut several solid colorful 2 1/2 inch squares to be used in between each strip. The squares can be any solid color. One color or several different color solids may be used.

Now that you have your fabric cut, sew the end of one strip to a solid square, sew right sides together using a 1/4 inch seam followed by another strip. Continue to build in this manner, adding a solid square then a strip of fabric.

Use your rotary cutter, mat and ruler to cut 40 inch strips. Line up your strips even with the previous one and stitch together until you have at least 8 strips sewn together.

Your block should be at least 16 inches by 40 inches.

The charity quilt committee will gladly take any size block, a complete lap size quilt will use a total of 25 strips.
